We have seen a great number baptized and so very many grow in their walk with the Lord that I get excited all over again just recollecting in my mind all that God has done while I write this to you.

So, I just want to encourage you to not give in to the fear and hysteria that is prevalent in the media and our communities. Our President and his administration are doing all they can to get us through this unprecedented moment in history. I have been praying for him and those who truly have the interest of our nation in their hearts and I hope that you will join me in prayer for him.

Having said that, I want to remind you that as followers of Jesus Christ we have an enemy and that enemy's domain is this world. Fear, panic, and lack of trust and faith in God are what he deals in daily.

Do not give in to the fear and the panic that the enemy is generating through those who deny God and promote Satan's agenda.

Psalm 46:2 reminds us, Therefore, we will not fear, though the earth give way and the mountains fall into the heart of the sea.

God's presence is always with us and I just encourage you to draw near to Him. Practice being in the presence of God moment by moment and day by day.

I understand the concern, but do not let this become and excuse for simply retreating from life and faith. Satan loves to isolate God's flock. It makes it easier for him to attack those that follow the Lord.

This crisis will pass, and we can come out the other side stronger in our faith in God and closer in our relationships with each other. And while toilet paper may have gone up in value in the eyes of many (eye roll inserted here) the phone is still and easy way to reach out and fellowship. So, text with each other and talk to each other via the phone. This is an opportunity to learn what that Face Time app really does. Please know that Dawn and I love you all and that the leadership of the Aulne Church is wrestling with how we can best minister, care and protect each of you that God has blesse us with. This will pass and then I suggest a big pot bless to celebrate.
